The origins of La Caoba cigars date back to the year 1910, in the city of Worms, Germany. In this city, Mauritz Stadecker, began the manufacture of cigars by hand with wooden molds and whose method is still used without variation until today.

In 1937 Sigfried Stadecker, son of Mauritz, taking advantage of friendships he had in Asunción, Paraguay established himself in this city, creating the first cigar factory in the country called "La Caoba".

From 1975 to the present, the company passes into the hands of Estela Stadecker, the only woman and youngest daughter of Mr. Sigfried who inherited from her predecessors the sensitivity and love for the art of manufacturing cigars and the craft techniques passed down from father to son.

## THE TIGRESS AND THE AVIATOR

Antoine de Saint-Exupéry, the author of "The Little Prince", came to Paraguay in 1929 for the purpose of inaugurating the Aeropostal Route, as well as to meet Hilda Ingenohl, the "Tigress", on the shores of Ypacarai lake.

Hilda, best known as the "Tigress", was one of the first pilot women of the world, and a brave adventurer. After meeting Antoine in Paris, she realized his intention to travel to Paraguay, and invited him to spend a few days in the city of San Bernardino, on the shores of said lake. Some people say that said passion story included a few more visits.

### Description:

A medium-strength cigar. The blending of aged Paraguayan autochthonous tobacco, Sumatra-Java tobacco, and Burley tobacco, generate deep flavors. The already-known blend of Paraguayan autochthonous tobacco and Sumatra-Java tobacco receives the contribution of coffee and wooden notes arising from Burley tobacco, a unique experience indeed.

(Bay of Asuncion)

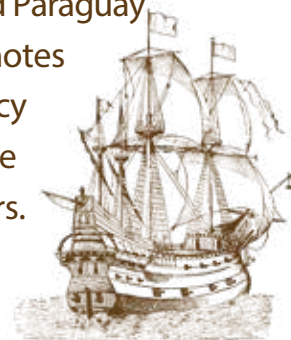
## SEVENTY CITIES

Innumerable expeditions departed from the natural bay of Asuncion, downtown of the city, and during three and a half centuries, establishing more than 70 cities, extending from the Rio de la Plata basin up to the remote shores of the Guapay river.

Since the very foundation of the city of Asuncion on that remote day of August 15, 1537, the bay of the Very Noble and Royal City of "Nuestra Señora de la Asunción" has become the starting point of such expeditions, which were of course full of epic anecdotes waiting to be discovered. The original autochthonous cigar, made with Paraguayan tobacco.

### Description:

A mild-strength cigar. The predominance of the aged Paraguay autochthonous tobacco, with its strong body and notes of leather and earth – together with a stimulant spicy flavor – suddenly disappears, and a persistent coffee flavor appears, creating a splendid balance of flavors.

# CAÑONES DE MI PATRIA

(Cannons of my Country)

## GOD'S JUSTICE!

In 1866, the technician and drawer Michael Hunter materialized the construction of a huge cannon with the purpose of fighting against the armored battleships during the War of the Triple Alliance.

Such cannon weighted 10 tons, and it was casted at an iron foundry in the city of Ybycuí using the bronze bells offered by the churches. Such bells were unhooked with full joy by the priests with a sense of revenge against all the rights which were breached during the "Guerra Grande" (Great War).

### Description:

This cigar has a medium-to-full strength. The blend obtained using the aged Paraguayan autochthonous tobacco and the Sumatra-Java tobacco - as filler tobacco and binder tobacco - produce a complex diversity of flavors since the very beginning up to the end. Firstly, we can notice the dominant notes of earth and leather, which are the characteristics of the Paraguayan autochthonous tobacco – imposing its presence – and then we can feel the arising notes of spicy and chocolate flavors of the Sumatra-Java tobacco. "Cañones de mi Patria" is a fine cigar, plenty of subtly arising intense flavors.
